Down through the years, the wisdom of Thomas Edison's mother (Nancy) still rings true to us today. Her son Thomas became the world's greatest inventor of the light bulb we can use today.



According to proverbs 31, we hear that a Godly mother understands what is true and what is right because her wisdom and knowledge comes from God. She understands God's plan of salvation because she knows the word of God. She teaches her children right from wrong.

2. A Godly mother has enormous trust. This trust comes from knowing Jesus. Jesus said, "All that the Father gives me will come to me, and whoever comes to me I will never drive away" (John 6:37)

A Mother says the same thing Jesus says and that is: "Whoever comes to me I will never drive away." Her arms are wide open to those who are in need and those in need can be assured of a confident relationship.



What should we remember to do on Mothers' Day for our mothers?
