IDEAS FOR PARENT INVOLVEMENT IN OUR SCHOOL

- 1. Give your name to Ms. Lori for inclusion on our substitute teaching list, get involved with the Teacher Appreciation Committee, or volunteer to do cutting/coloring activities from your home. All these opportunities provide important contributions to our school's success.
- 2. Due to COVID our traditional fall evening family activities are cancelled, and we won't be inviting parents into our classrooms for mystery reader, etc. While that is sad for all of us, we will continue to monitor COVID cases in Johnson County and may be able to add some events or parent involvement in our spring semester.
- 3. Read the newsletter and notes that come home thoroughly and share ideas and feedback regularly. We can't always act on every idea that comes our way, but your ideas are always given consideration and are very much appreciated.

COMMUNICATION

Please be sure to keep us apprised of any change in emails, phone numbers, etc. We want to be sure you get all communication from school in a timely manner. Please make it a habit to check your child's backpack every school day for messages. Lori is always available to talk with parents about suggestions, concerns, or questions. Two-way communication is key! We would strongly prefer you discuss any concerns you have with staff instead of other parents who are not able to address or solve your problems.

FINE MOTOR

We continue to be amazed at the technological proficiency our little ones are growing up with. While this will certainly serve them well, please remember the importance of having your child frequently use pencils, markers, crayons etc. Fine motor skills are important to a young child's development and holding writing instruments are a different skill set than children use operating electronic devices such as I-Pads and playing games on cell phones. Writing, coloring, and cutting are skills that can easily be encouraged in your home and are worked on here at school.

ACTIVITY SHEETS

We are a "no work sheet" school because research has shown that is not how preschoolers learn best. Our teachers have numerous resources to utilize in developing your child's cognitive growth as we engage in hands on learning. I know some parents and some children love to have work sheets to do in together in one-on-one fashion in your home environment. I will occasionally have work sheets on the black table outside the office you can take home you may do with your child to extend some of the areas we work on here at school. Please remember they will be spread through developmental levels for 3 - 5- year-olds, so some may be too easy or too difficult for your child. These are totally optional and a fast, easy way to provide parents an activity they can do with their child at home at their convenience, and to work on pencil/marker/scissor control.

CLASS ROSTERS

Class rosters will be sent home via backpacks for all classes as soon as we have time to make all the corrections. Please keep your copy handy if you need it for birthday invitations, to arrange play dates, etc. If you don't want your personal information shared at school for any reason, please let Ms. Lori know immediately.

ALERT SYSTEM

We have contracted with an alert service to do mass communication with parents about important events and reminders via voice mail, email, and/or texts. It is important you keep us updated with any changes in phone numbers so you will receive these. Also – a helpful hint is that when an alert is sent to your phone it will come from (913) 888-6300. Please remember this is a recorded message so there may be a slight delay before the message begins and please listen to the message in its entirety <u>before</u> calling the preschool.

NEWSLETTERS

If you have trouble reading our newsletters on your phone, please use another electronic device. We have learned anything we drop into our newsletters often becomes jumbled on phones. They read well from other electronic devices.

REMINDERS

Please send your child in clothing they can easily maneuver themselves to make going potty easier. Closed toed shoes help us ensure fewer injuries to vulnerable toes. As the weather changes, layers work great as kids can take off or add layers depending on the weather each day.

TODDLER CDO

We would like to extend a warm welcome to our toddlers and their families! We are excited to begin our school year, which for many will be a "first experience" at school. This month our goal is to help each child feel comfortable and happy in the classroom. Our centers will be filled with exciting activities for your toddlers to play with as they learn. At circle time we will ring bells and sing "We are Happy". We will do finger plays, count red apples, explore different textures, learn about colors, and have fun with bubbles. Some of the books we will be reading are <u>Brown Bear</u>, <u>Brown Bear</u>; <u>The Apple Pie Tree</u>; and <u>My Friend & Me</u>.
